1. Ordinance C2024-3 Moratorium on Commercial Solar Arrays

Marcia Delaware stated that it is apparent that we need a moratorium in place so we can properly consider how we want to write our own Ordinance. It would go into effect thirty days after it has passed and there are two areas that have been in discussion with code enforcement and those would be grandfathered in. Dan Davis from Cambridge addressed the Council stating that he owns property that is being leased by Novel. They are the parent company that has leased five lots in Dexter. Mr. Davis stated that there can't be more than five solar gardens in Dexter because of the substation. He read a letter that Novel had sent. He questioned why the Town has now decided to make a moratorium when the State already has their own rules in place. There were many comments from the public including the moratorium not being long enough, fear of streams being polluted, the Town needing to look out for themselves because the State isn't going to, and how will it benefit the Town. Andrew Bermudez stated that he can see both sides and he doesn't want the Council to jump to decisions based on their own feelings. All the facts need to be considered and do what is in the best interest of the Town. He feels the moratorium is a good idea for now to give us ample time to do research and consider both sides. Mr. Davis asked the Council to do their own research on soar panels. Many of them are not made of liquids and will not leach into the ground.

## IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Manager's Report

Trampas King thanked the road crew because with the last two storms they were kept quite busy. 3. Ordinance C2024-3 Moratorium on Commercial Solar Arrays
THE TOWN OF DEXTER HEREBY ORDAINS A MORATORIUM ORDINANCE REGARDING
COMMERCIAL SOLAR ARRAYS

WHEREAS, the Maine Legislature enacted several laws intended to encourage development of renewable energy projects in the State of Maine;

WHEREAS, as a result of these laws, developers are proposing unprecedented numbers of commercial solar arrays throughout the State;

WHEREAS, the Code of the Town of Dexter, Maine (the "Town Code") does not include any regulations related to commercial solar arrays, and this use would likely fall under the category of "essential services," which receive no substantive review and are subject to few approval standards; and WHEREAS, the unregulated location and operation of commercial solar arrays within the Town of Dexter raises legitimate and substantial concerns about environmental, health and safety impacts of such uses, as well as visual impacts and other considerations related to the appropriate siting of these arrays; WHEREAS, the Town's current ordinances are insufficient to prevent serious public harm that could be caused by the unregulated development of commercial solar arrays;

WHEREAS, a moratorium is necessary to allow the Town to analyze and plan properly for increased development of commercial solar arrays; and

WHEREAS, the Council, Planning Board and Code Enforcement Officer shall study the current Town Code to determine appropriate amendments to address commercial solar arrays; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that such a study, review, and development of recommended Ordinance, changes will take at least one hundred and eighty (180) days from the date the Town enacts this Moratorium Ordinance;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Dexter, that the following Moratorium Ordinance on Commercial Solar Arrays be, and hereby is, enacted and, in furtherance thereof, the Town Council does hereby declare a moratorium on the location, operation or licensing of commercial solar arrays within the Town.

For the purposes of this Moratorium, "commercial solar array" is defined as a solar energy collection structure of any size that primarily serves an offsite user such as the electric power grid.

This Moratorium Ordinance shall take effect once enacted by the Town Council, in accordance with the provisions of the Town Code, but shall be applicable as of May 11, 2024, as expressly provided below. The moratorium shall remain in effect for one hundred and eighty (180) days from the effective of this Ordinance, unless extended, repealed, or modified by the Town Council, for the express purpose of drafting an amendment or amendments to the current Town Code to protect the public from health and safety risks including, but not limited to, compatibility of commercial solar arrays with existing and permitted uses in residential, commercial and industrial zoning districts.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that this Moratorium Ordinance shall apply to commercial solar arrays that are proposed to be located within the Town on or after the May 11, 2024, applicability date of this Ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that notwithstanding the provisions of 1 M.R.S.A. § 302 or any other law to the contrary, this Moratorium Ordinance, when enacted, shall govern any proposed commercial solar array for which an application for a building permit, Certificate of Occupancy, site plan or any other required approval has not been submitted to and granted final approval by the Code Enforcement Officer, Planning Board or other Town official or board prior to May 11, 2024, the applicability date of this Moratorium Ordinance; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that no person or organization shall develop or operate a commercial solar array within the Town on or after the May 11, 2024, applicability date of this Moratorium Ordinance without complying with whatever ordinance amendment or amendments the town meeting may enact as a result of this Moratorium Ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that during the time this Moratorium Ordinance is in effect, no officer, official, employee, office, administrative board or agency of the Town shall accept, process, approve, deny, or in any other way act upon any application for a license, building permit or any other type of land use approval or permit and/or any other permits or licenses related to a commercial solar array; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that those provisions of the current Town Code that are inconsistent or conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent that they are applicable for the duration of the moratorium hereby ordained, and as it may be extended as permitted by law, but not otherwise; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that if commercial solar arrays are established in contravention of this Moratorium, each day of any continuing violation shall constitute a separate violation of this Moratorium Ordinance, and the Town shall be entitled to all rights available to it in law and equity, including, but not limited to, fines and penalties, injunctive relief, and its reasonable attorney's fees and costs in prosecuting any such violations; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that should any section or provision of this Moratorium Ordinance be declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid; such a declaration shall not invalidate any other section or provision.
